We Believe in Neighbors Helping Neighbors...

We, on the Wheeling Township Board, believe that no one should go hungry. While providing food assistance and addressing the food-insecurity needs of Wheeling Township residents, we are happy to share the news that the Food Pantry is now able to assist *more* people in the community.

Wheeling Township's Food Pantry was originally located in a closet in 1969, and people in need were given pre-packaged bags of food. When the Township moved to its current location in 1977, the Pantry established itself in the lower level of the building. In 2012, the Pantry evolved from providing pre-packed bags of food to the truly ground-breaking 'Client Choice' model, which allows clients to choose foods they like (and will eat) in a respectful, grocery store-like setting.

In the Fall of 2018 we expanded the Food Pantry, through a grant from the Greater Chicago Food Depository and Township Supervisor
a significant donation from the Arlington Heights Rotary (Sunset Club). Thanks to their support, we were able to complete this expansion project. We are also grateful to the Arlington Heights Rotary (Noon Club) for their continued support. The larger space

allows us to efficiently serve more clients, and also help to feed those with special dietary needs. Another real benefit of the larger space is the ability for us to offer more personal essentials and paper products – items for which SNAP benefits cannot be used.

We are incredibly grateful for those donations, as well as to the Wheeling High School Boys Basketball team for undertaking the huge project of moving the mountains of donated food back into the finished pantry.

Food, essentials and paper products are donated by this amazing community throughout the year, for which the Township is truly grateful. Your generosity allows us to be the vehicle by which our neighbors in need can easily and respectfully receive assistance. In the summer, your fresh produce supplements clients' pantry staples.

The Wheeling Township Food Pantry is a 501(c)(3) not for profit organization, and is supported by donations and volunteers. To be eligible for access to the Pantry, an individual needs to reside in Wheeling Township and meet the necessary income requirements. We currently see over 400 residents on a monthly basis – 37% of whom are Senior Citizens. We will never turn anyone away if they are in need of food – emergency bags are always at the ready.

SENIOR RENEWAL APPLICATIONS MAILED

Senior Exemptions must be renewed every year. In January the Cook County Assessor's Office mailed renewal applications for property tax exemptions to seniors who applied for the senior exemption last year and are living at the same residence.

The renewal form is a two-part application. The front of the renewal application must be completed by ALL seniors – EVEN IF YOU DO NOT QUALIFY FOR THE SENIOR FREEZE. You only need to complete the back if the total gross household income is under \$65,000 for the 2017 income tax year. This income limit increased in 2017. To qualify for the freeze, you must also have resided in your home as a principal residence as of January 1, 2017. The savings from the exemptions will appear on the second installment tax bills mailed in July of 2019. The first installment is 55% of the previous year's total tax bill. First installment bills were mailed in February and are due on March 1, 2019.

ELIGIBILITY FOR SENIOR CITIZEN EXEMPTIONS(Born in 1953 or Earlier)

There are two Senior Citizen property tax exemptions:

- The Senior Exemption is available to all seniors regardless of income. It reduces the Equalized Assessed Value by \$8,000. The \$8,000 is multiplied by the current tax rate and deducted from the second installment property tax bill. This amount increased in 2017.
- 2) The **Senior Freeze** will provide seniors with additional savings if the combined **gross** income of **all** occupants in the household is less than \$65,000 (income tax year 2017), and if the senior has been an owner-occupant of the house since January 1, 2017.

Exemptions can only be taken on one property, the owner's principal residence. If you need assistance contact us at 847-259-1515 or visit the Wheeling Township Assessor's office. We ask that you have the 14-digit property index number (PIN) available which can be found at the top of the tax bill. If filling the Senior Freeze, please bring your 2017 Federal Income Tax Return (1040), a tax bill and an I.D. at the property address.

Homeowners who were born in 1953 and turned 65 in 2018 would not have received senior application forms in the mail. A first-time applicant must complete the 2018 Senior Exemption application or the 2018 Senior Freeze application and attach a copy of the most recent property tax bill and a current driver's license, or a valid Illinois State I.D with the address of the subject property. The forms are available at our office or at www.cookcountyassessor.com.



The application can be dropped off at our office or mailed directly to the address on the form.

Homeowners born in 1954 and turn 65 in 2019 will be eligible for the Senior Exemptions in 2020 when Cook County property owners pay property taxes for 2019.

DISABLED PERSONS AND DISABLED VETERANS RENEWAL FORMS

Disabled Persons or Disabled Veterans **renewal** exemption applications are mailed after the senior renewal exemption applications. Disabled Veterans must provide a current VA letter each year.

If you appealed your 2018 assessed value with the Cook County Assessor or the Cook County Board of Review and received a reduction, it will be reflected on the second installment tax bill.

2019 GENERAL ELECTIONS AND VOTER REGISTRATION

Although we just completed the Gubernatorial and Congressional Elections this past November, local Municipal elections will be held shortly. These elections will select your local Mayors and Legislative Officials, including school boards that directly affect our lives. For example, In Arlington Heights, voters will go to the polls on April 2, 2019 to elect four village trustees and two library trustees, as well as school district, and park district officials. Other municipal and local offices within Wheeling Township will also hold Local elections, including Buffalo Grove, Mount Prospect, and Prospect Heights. These are non-partisan elections with just a Consolidated General Election.

If you want to vote in these elections, now is time to make sure you are registered. If you are not registered, have just moved into the Township, have moved to another residence in the Township, or changed your name, you need to register to be able to vote in these elections. To register, come to the Clerk's Office, Monday-Friday, between 9:00-4:30. All you need are two forms of identification (one showing your current address), to be a citizen of the United States, 18 years of age or older by the April 2, 2019 Consolidated General Election, and to have lived in the Township for at least 30 days before the election. For naturalized citizens, you must prove the date of your naturalization. If you have an Illinois driver's license or state ID, you may register online through the Illinois State Board of Elections

website **elections.il.gov.** If you don't have a driver's license or state ID, go to **cookcountyclerk.com** and complete the form online, print, sign and mail it to the address on the application. If you register by mail, you must bring a valid state issued picture identification when you vote for the first time.

PENALTIES FOR NO VEHICLE STICKERS FOR UNINCORPORATED AREAS

If you are a resident living in an unincorporated area of Wheeling Township, you must have your Cook County vehicle sticker. There is no late penalty for new residents who have moved into the unincorporated Cook County area within the last 60 days. After 60 days, penalties will apply. For those who failed to purchase a vehicle sticker by July 1, 2018 or after moving into an unincorporated area for more than 60 days, Cook County has sent a notice of violation and will be sending a final a Final Notification Notice to non-compliant residents in February. Per the Wheel Tax ordinance, a penalty on each class of vehicle license will be assessed. If you want to resolve failing to purchase a vehicle sticker, contact The Cook County Department of Revenue at 312-603-6961.

TOWNSHIP ROAD MANAGEMENT

WHAT ABOUT GRADING...

With spring approaching, the construction season will begin in earnest. As you plan your next building project, remember to check with Cook County Building and Zoning first. They may require a construction permit to ensure that the project complies with current building and zoning codes. In addition to new construction, Cook County requires building permits for a wide range of remodeling projects, from home additions to new sheds or driveways. And depending on the scope of the project, the County may also require a Grading and Drainage Plan to be prepared, reviewed and approved by Wheeling Township Road Management.

If required, the purpose of a grading plan is to design more suitable topography for homes and other structures to control water run-off and to minimize soil erosion and sedimentation both during and after construction. Essentially, lot grading is reshaping the ground surface so that water run-off from each lot is directed to a stable outlet rather than to an adjacent lot. Typically, the stable outlet is the drainage ditch along the road or roads adjacent to the lot.

The Grading and Drainage Plan must be prepared by a certified civil engineer. The plan will include all practices necessary for controlling erosion on the graded site and to minimize sedimentation downstream. This may include establishing new surface swales or subsurface drainage systems to properly direct water run-off. Any surfaces disturbed by grading must then be stabilized with grass or other vegetation, crushed stone, riprap or other ground cover as soon as the grading is completed.

Cook County Building and Zoning and Wheeling Township Road Management will send inspectors to your construction site at various stages of the project to make sure the work is being done according to the permitted plan. This includes inspecting the lot grading. Once completed, an as-built plan showing exactly how the lot was graded must be provided to both Cook County and Wheeling Township Road Management. This will confirm that the grading was done according to the approved Grading and Drainage Plan.

More Than Just a Meal

Wheeling Township administers a home-delivered hot meal program (Meals on Wheels) for residents of Wheeling Township who meet eligibility requirements. This program provides a hot, nutritious meal delivered at mid-day, Monday through Friday, right to the door of the recipient by a friendly volunteer. Applicants must agree to receive meals five days a week, Monday-Friday.

Who is eligible?

- Must be a senior over 60 or permanently disabled individual over 18
- Must reside within Wheeling Township
- Must be homebound and no longer driving
- Must not have a full-time caregiver

A home assessment is required, and participation in the program is subject to availability on a route.

Cost of the meals?

The cost of the one hot meal is \$6.40 per day. A supplementary cold meal is available

for an additional \$4.35 per day. Bills are mailed monthly for the meals received.

• Cholesterol Screening (\$15 charge) Available to residents 18 years & older. Test provides a lipid profile including total cholesterol, HDL, LDL, triglycerides and blood sugar.

Patients need to fast 10-12 hours; but remember to please drink plenty of water to remain hydrated! (but no coffee/tea/soda/juice, etc).


Medicare can be complicated... SHIP Could Help You!



If you are enrolled in Medicare, are close to enrolling in Medicare, or have health insurance questions, Wheeling Township's SHIP Counselors may be able to help you. Our dedicated and knowledgeable volunteers are trained by the Illinois Department of Insurance to assist Medicare participants with understanding their benefit coverage, helping with filing medical bills and claims, explaining Medicare Supplemental and Part D Insurance, and providing resolution support for problems.

SHIP counselors can also assist those seniors who qualify for both Medicare and full benefit Medicaid with their enrollment in the Medicare-Medicaid Alignment Initiative, also known as MMAI. With this program you may choose to enroll in a health plan and receive all of your benefits through one MMAI health plan. If you feel you qualify for MMAI, make an appointment with Lou Barnett, our SHIP Coordinator.
