# **ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT:** Administrator Stellato reported:

- The new Northwest Community Hospital Mobile Dental Clinic dedication took place on August 25, 2016. After being on the road for more than twelve years, the unit was replaced with an updated, state of art new vehicle. Former Supervisor Michael Schroeder, in an effort to make dental services available to low income residents, was instrumental in making the original clinic a reality. At the dedication, his family was presented a duplicate of the plaque that is hung on the vehicle in his memory.
- Both Mary Sebastian and Administrator Stellato have taken annual FOIA training and received certificates verifying completion.
- Administrator Stellato have responded to a number of FOIA requests in the last few weeks. The most recent arrived yesterday and requests six to eight years of various records for the Road district. Because of the substantial number of documents requested, we are going to exercise our right to ask for an additional 5 days to respond. Administrator Stellato can provide most of the documents from her vendor files, but has asked the Highway Department to provide documents showing their bidding process, procedures and final

decisions made on all projects for road maintenance and construction over the last six years.

- Wheeling Township is very close to using all that was dedicated for TRIP rides.
  At this point, we are still providing rides on a very limited basis to those passengers we know have no other option.
- September 21, 2016 was Illinois Township Day. Wheeling Township chose to dedicate this day to help raise awareness, support and to thank all our first responders. Banners were hung on our property announcing our undertaking and pizzas were delivered to various police and fire stations within the community.

# **INITIAL 2016 LEVY DISCUSSION**

Administrator Stellato prepared a worksheet estimating revenues and expenses that the Township projects to raise and spend. Using the CPI for the projected levy could bring Town Fund reserves to about 1.43 times expenses by February 28, 2018. The Township Auditor has indicated that reserves in the 1 to 1.5 times range is acceptable but the Board would like to see other levy possibilities. The Town Fund expenses may rise about \$100,000 in the next year because of increased insurance, utilities, salary increases. No major capital projects are planned. Cook County adds about 3% to levies to collection and it is called loss and costs. The Township could ask the county for a number less than 3%, or even ask them to disregard the 3%, but it is probably best to adjust the levy to account for the county adjustment. General Assistance and Emergency Assistance caseloads have been down the last few years, however peripheral services and food pantry visits have increased. Tentative levies must be approved in November before final approval in December. The Highway Commissioner suggested, that for levy planning, the Road District's full budget be used for estimated expenses. Because of flood prone buyouts by Cook County, there is some uncertainty if any costs may arise.
