Last fall they began with a Bean Drive, collecting canned goods from their neighbors. This spring they have increased activities to include a lemonade stand, a cookie sale, and an art sale. But perhaps the most interesting and most profitable activity is tours of their Gnome Village. For only a quarter, which is a steal of a deal, visitors can see all the various handmade buildings in which the gnomes reside. Highlights include a play ground, swimming pool and private residences where gnomes hang their laundry to dry. The village may soon include a police or fire station and maybe even a food pantry. ## UNDERSTANDING MEDICARE PART D

### Prescription Drug Coverage Choices

*Open Enrollment for Medicare Part D is October 15 – December 7*

Seniors have many choices when it comes to Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Coverage. Understanding those choices can insure that you receive the prescription drugs you require at the most beneficial cost to you. Join Wheeling Township's SHIP counselors as they explain how Medicare Part D works, and how they can help you make the best choices when it comes to your prescription needs. The session will include a live internet demonstration of the tools you can use to personalize your Part D drug coverage, information on how and when to enroll/change plans, and explanations of various programs that may allow you to save money on your prescription drugs.

Whether you are able to attend the presentation or not, you can schedule a one-on-one appointment with a SHIP counselor to review your Part D drug coverage during the annual enrollment period. SHIP counselors are not affiliated with any insurance company. Call the Township office to set up your appointment.

If you are a member of a local civic group, faith community or an organization that would like to learn more about Medicare and how recent changes might affect you, our SHIP volunteers are available to speak to your group.

Thinking about giving up the keys? Know someone who should?

Giving up the keys – or even just talking about it – can be one of the toughest things seniors, adult children, Doctors and/or caregivers have to face, and many people simply refuse to

consider the idea. Have you ever thought about what YOU would do if you were no longer able to drive? How would you maintain your independence? Who would you turn to for assistance? Or do you think your loved one should stop driving?

Many seniors know that they should no longer sit behind the wheel of a car due to vision or other health issues, but continue to keep driving because they are unaware of other options. That's where this program may help! Join Wheeling Township for an informative discussion on giving up the keys and thinking ahead.

We will focus on sharing information about the many terrific transportation options available to our community's seniors should you (or your loved one) decide to give up driving. We'll also take a look at some of the reasons why you may need to stop driving, along with some warning signs that others should consider when watching an older adult drive. Lastly, representatives from Wheeling Township's own transportation department, PACE, and Escorted Transportation Service NW will be on hand to share ideas, viable transportation alternatives and other resources so that you and your family can make an informed decision.

Making the decision not to drive definitely alters an older person's daily routine and habits, but doesn't necessarily signal an end to independence. It's not an easy thought or discussion for anyone, but knowing that there are other options can make the transition easier. We hope you'll join us for this really useful session.



## MEDICAL SERVICES

Wheeling Township recognizes the importance of older adults to remain living independently in their homes and their communities.

The following health services, administered by the Township nurse, are available **by appointment**, for residents 60 years and over.



### Tuesdays & Thursdays

9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

- Blood Pressure (no charge)
- Blood Sugar Screening (\$1 charge)
- INR & PRO Time – Anticoagulation Therapy Testing (\$6 charge)

### Cholesterol Screening:

2nd & 4th Thursday of Each Month • 9:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.

(Available to residents 18 years & older)

Eight hour fasting (water only) lipid profile including total cholesterol, HDL, LDL, triglycerides and blood sugar (\$15.00 charge) Cholesterol screenings require drawing of a blood sample from the fingertip.

## Worried about the Flu? Homebound? Call Karen!

Again this year, the Township nurse will have a limited supply of the flu shots for homebound patients over the age of eighteen who are unable to get a flu shot from their physician. Please call Karen McNeir, R.N., B.S.N. to schedule a home visit. The flu shot is covered by Medicare. If you do not have Medicare coverage, the cost is \$25.00

Much more than just a ride!



**Unable to drive? Looking for safe and affordable transportation?**

If you are over 60 (or 18 and over with a permanent disability), Wheeling Township's outstanding transportation service and team may be the perfect solution for your needs. With 8 buses on the road every day, we are doing our very best to help Township residents get where they need to be. Last year, over 24,500 rides were provided to Township residents.

**When is the service available?** Rides are available for Township residents to a wide variety of locations within the Township, Monday – Friday, 9:00 am - 3:30 pm. Some locations outside the Township are covered for medical services.

**When should I call?** For medical appointments, please call at least one week in advance, as buses fill up quickly (you may call up to 30 days in advance for medical appointments). For casual appointments (hair salon, grocery store, etc), you must call two days in advance.

**What's the cost?** \$2 each way.

**How do I sign up?** Call our transportation department if you have any questions – or for an application. Our team of drivers are dedicated, compassionate and truly concerned about your well-being. Don't hesitate to call – or stop by – should you have any questions about whether we can assist you or not.

In cooperation with AARP, Wheeling Township offers the AARP Safe Driving Program, designed to help you **tune up** your driving skills, **learn** about normal age-related physical changes, **adjust** your driving to **allow** for the changes and **reduce** your traffic violations.

Call Wheeling Township to register for one of the following two day sessions. A \$15.00 charge for AARP members and \$20.00 for non-members applies for the two-session class. Checks should be made payable to AARP and mailed or dropped off at the Township Office prior to your first class.

## THE MOBILE DENTAL CLINIC



The Mobile Dental Clinic is a partnership with Northwest Community Hospital and Elk Grove, Palatine, Schaumburg and Wheeling Townships. It provides necessary dental care to residents who do not have the resources to go to a general dentist. Residents must meet financial guidelines and there is a cost of \$30 per visit. ## KIDS WORKING TOGETHER TO HELP STOCK THE FOOD PANTRY

On Friday, May 13th, **Olive Mary Stitt** elementary students collected 295 grocery bags full of food for the Wheeling Township Food Pantry. This marked the end of their month long **"Hunger Doesn't Take a Summer Vacation"** food drive, which was done as a part of the Character Counts Program. For the past several years, students at Olive Mary Stitt had been collecting food in October, in conjunction with Make A Difference Day. Last year, parents heard how low the food pantry is during the summer months and decided to move the date to make it a learning experience for the five pillars of Character Counts, which are Respect, Responsibility, Caring, Fairness and Citizenship. Coordinating the drive at the end of the school year was a great way to help the pantry get through the summer months when donations generally tend to be lower and usage is higher.
